Do Old Garden Roses only bloom in the spring?

No. Some varieties bloom in the spring or early summer. Some bloom in the spring and again in the fall. But most of the varieties which thrive in our climate bloom all year long.

Where can I get Old Garden Roses?

The best news of all is that Old Garden Roses, unlike Modern Roses, can be propagated by rooting cuttings from old rose plants. It's like owning an antique which can be cloned. Some local nurseries are beginning to carry old roses. Buy only own-root roses (not budded or grafted), and only those varieties which thrive here.
